It is also suggested that you not restrict yourself to material taken from school courses. Essays should be in the range of 2,000 to 4,000 words.

- What, if anything, is wrong with the British constitution?
- ➤ What is the greatest threat to free speech in Britain today?
- > Should elected leaders be limited in the amount of time they can serve in office?
- > Is economic inequality necessarily a political problem?
- ➤ Is there a trade-off between privacy and security?
- ➤ Why should we worry about populism?
- > Does the rise of social media make politics more polarised?
- ➤ Has Barack Obama's presidency been a failure?
- ➤ Does the rise of China threaten international security?
