POLIS MPhil Student Awarded MBE

Major Damian Flanagan, a current student on the MPhil International Relations and Politics programme was awarded an MBE in the Military Division of the Queen's New Year Honours List 2018. The award was in recognition of service during his previous appointment in the Army Headquarters where he was responsible for officers' terms of service and manpower policies.

In this post he devised and implemented an array of modernising initiatives addressing all stages of an Army officer's career: from scholarship and bursary schemes to attract officer entrants, through proposed changes to promotion rules, to adjustments in the length and structure of an officer's full career.

This period of time saw increased focus on the Army's personnel programmes, for all ranks, including the introduction of flexible working arrangements and the opening of all roles to women. Major Flanagan was instrumental in moving forward these complex and sensitive programmes designed to 'Maximise Talent', benefitting both the individual and the organisation. His was a substantial contribution to maintaining the Army's unique position in society as a fair and inclusive employer – respected, and respectful of diversity – whilst upholding its responsibility to maintain the defence and security of the nation.



The Business of Excellence

Justin Hughes, a current POLIS student in the Master of Studies in International Relations programme is celebrating the release of his latest book in paperback. Justin is a former RAF pilot and veteran of over 250 displays with the Red Arrows, and is now the managing director of Mission Excellence, a consultancy firm that partners with organizations committed to high performance.

His book, *The Business of Excellence* offers a unique and compelling perspective on the drivers of excellence in teams and organizations, bringing together case studies from Justin's wide and varied experience.



Award for 'Political Islam in Tunisia'

The American Library Association's *Choice* magazine has chosen 'Political Islam in Tunisia' as one of its Outstanding Academic Titles for 2017.

The study aims to uncover the secret history of Tunisia's main Islamist movement, and is the work of Anne Wolf, a Junior Research Fellow in Politics at Girton College.

As the first full history of the Ennahda movement, this book is a major contribution to the literature on Tunisia, Islamist movements, and political Islam in the Arab world.

POLIS Student's Documentary Airs



Horizon follows the story of Richard Gray and his remarkable recovery from a life changing catastrophic stroke. The film shows - in extraordinary detail - the rarely seen journey back to recovery. Recorded by his wife Fiona Lloyd-Davies, a Master of Studies student at POLIS, 'Richard's War' shows, in uncompromising detail, the hard work of recovery.

Initially bed bound and unable to do anything, including speak the initial outlook was bleak, yet occasionally small glimmers of hope emerged. Armed always with her camera Fiona captures the moment Richard moves his fingers for the first time, and then over months she documents his struggle to relearn how to walk again.

The story also features poignant footage delivered in a series of flashbacks – in which we see and hear Richard at his professional best. He was a peacekeeper with the United Nations, immersed in the brutal war in Sarajevo, Bosnia.

We also hear from the surgeons and clinicians who were integral to Richard's remarkable recovery, from describing lifesaving surgery, high-risk reconstructive surgery, to intensive rehabilitation programmes that push the former soldier to his limits. As the film starts Fiona asks "will Richard, my Richard still be there?" By the end the answer is clear...
